## Winemaker's Notes

2023 was yet another challenging year in Tasmania. A long cool growing season led to great flavours but with plenty of disease pressure to keep us on our toes. The outcome of this tricky season is aromatic wines with complex flavour concentration, ripe structure and lovely mid palate weight. Pinot also had another great year, and we celebrate the return of the East Coast parcels Another promising year from a great variety of challenges.

## Bouquet

Lifted, fresh cut strawberry and Morello cherries gives way to subtle and complex spice from whole bunch inclusion and quality French Oak

## Palate

The entry is gently sweet and aided by balanced natural acidity. Bright cherry, raspberry and blueberry notes flow on the palate. Subtle spice and savoury notes add to the complexity. Its delicate shape and carefully considered use of whole bunches and French Oak revolve around the purity of fruit, it is poised and balanced, true to style.
